See which door you will be closest to, and unload at that entrance closest to your space.

In addition the members provide over 40 handling classes in 2012, the Spring Fling show, support of Judges Education, Junior Scholarship, support of several non-profit organizations and worthwhile endeavours.

AKC registered dog...but not with the Canadian Kennel Club.



If you have a dog registered with the American Kennel Club you have three options for consideration: 1} register the dog with the CKC (a good idea if entrant is used for breeding); 2} apply for an Event Registration Number (ERN) this allows the dog to be recorded with the CKC for the purposes of competitions and earning titles; 3} the dog may be entered as "Listed" if the dog is register-able with the CKC. The down-side is that the dog can not be titled as "listed" and there is an additional \$9.41 fee with EACH entry (ie. each day). The cost of this can escalate. The second option is popular and if you are in a rush, usually the fastest. For details go to <a href="https://www.ckc.ca">www.ckc.ca</a> for more information.

The regular classes and Specials only are very similar to AKC shows. The point system for Canadian show is published in the premium list. There are a few variations but the more common questions or concerns included in the segment. For breeds with lower entries, they can gain additional point(s) for placing in the group. There are also additional classes for Puppy (no extra championship points) and an unofficial Bred by Competition. Sweepstakes is open to all dogs (so long as age requirements are met) and Junior Handling entries can be taken at the show or specialty (there is no ownership requirement as with Junior Showmanship).





Grease may be the word but 10 is the number.....

Tradex is 10 minutes from the Trans Canada

Highway, 10 minutes from Abbotsford and 10

minutes from the US Border Crossing.

The show is located right across the street from the Abbotsford Airport. There are many <code>WestJet</code> and <code>AirCanada</code> flights each day. While the terminal is not large it does offer many conveniences including a shuttle service to hotels that is reasonably priced. One option is that you cart the dog to the dog show...about 1 minute away....inside to your reserved grooming space....get set up for the show and later go to your hotel, have dinner and relax. Some items like grooming table, dryer, ex pens can be rented at the show and ex-paper and plastic can be purchased at a nominal fee. It really is pretty easy and as word spreads is becoming more popular each year.

Why is it called Travel the World show....



The Lower Mainland Dog Fanciers offer two shows each year. One is usually in the spring. It is smaller and the judges traditionally are from Canada and the United States. The Fall show grew in size and the club was better able to present judges from around the world with expertise that came from judging in many countries and with a different background. As the show grew so did the theme. We continue to have Canadian and American judges but over the years have added judges from Europe, Asia, South America, Australia, New Zealand, Africa and from all corners of the world. The club offers the exhibitors an opportunity to receive opinions not just from their locale but from those who do Travel the World. The theme has worked, not always without controversy (unless you win BIS), but what good show doesn't have that!!
